HE TEACHES COURSES ON PSYCHOANALYSIS AT THE MINNESOTA PSYCHOANALYTIC INSTITUTE AND THE TWO-YEAR PSYCHOANALYTIC PSYCHOTHERAPY TRAINING PROGRAM. HE IS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MPSI PSYCHOTHERAPY CENTER WHICH HE CO-FOUNDED IN 2009. THE CENTER PROVIDES PSYCHODYNAMIC PSYCHOTHERAPY TO PEOPLE WHO CANNOT AFFORD MENTAL HEALTH CARE.

HAL HAS A PRIVATE PRACTICE SPECIALIZING IN COUPLES AND INDIVIDUAL ADULTS. HE ALSO CONDUCTS ONGOING CONSULTATION GROUPS AND PROVIDES SUPERVISION INCLUDING SUPERVISION FOR THOSE SEEKING LPC OR LPCC LICENSURE. HAL HAS A KEEN INTEREST IN INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES AND THE WAYS DIFFERENT THEORIES AND TECHNICAL APPROACHES HELP PATIENTS TO CHANGE AND GROW.
